### ■ BEST DIVE BOOK EVER READ?

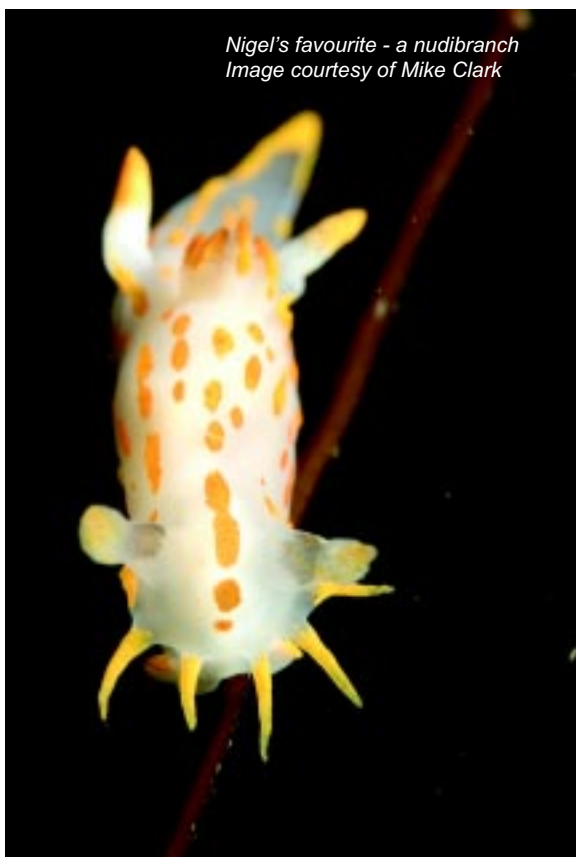
● 'Deeper into Diving' - a classic.
